You May Want to Check

Our colleague Jon Kerr in Washington State noted on the Policy Committee call the other day that in his state, the eligibility requirements for state “ability to benefit” funds to support college students is tied directly to the federal Pell criteria.

One of the new eligibility provisions for Pell effective in July 2012 is a high school diploma or equivalency.

If your eligibility requirements for your state “ability to benefit” funds are based on the Pell requirements, you may want to see about amending them to include adults without a diploma or equivalency especially if you have integrated education and training programs with dual enrollments.

We want dual enrolled pathway students to qualify for state support in case we cannot get the Pell provisions changed.
