LOCATION and DATES: The C&CR Training Design Institute will be held April 28 – May 2 in conjunction with the National Family Literacy Conference at the Galt House in Louisville, KY.

CONTENT: A plenary session including presentations by Susan Pimentel, one of the designers of the Common Core and Cheryl Keenan, Office of Vocational and Adult Education, is followed by two two-day strands that will provide toolkits, strategies, and resources:

BENEFIT: Participants will return to your state with:

- Instructional strategies and resources that will enable your teachers and program managers to upgrade instruction to meet the new higher standards
- Strategies for engaging all teachers in unpacking standards, aligning resources to those standards and aligning assignments with the standards.
- Strategies and resources to upgrade your teachers' content knowledge needed to teach to the higher standards.
- Recommendations for a two year professional development plan to implement, evaluate and modify standards-based services to teachers and their services to their students.

SCHEDULE: Plan to arrive on Sunday, April 28 (unless you want to attend any of the NCFL preconference on Saturday and/or Sunday) and depart on Thursday morning, May 2. NOTE on the attached detailed agenda that Wednesday afternoon is devoted to the critical merging of the strands as state teams work together to plan recommendations for state implementation. To receive full benefit of the institute, please plan to commit to being in the room until 5 pm.

COST: The registration fee is \$300 which includes daytime meals and all training materials and resources. Thank you to NCFL for managing the registration for the Institute.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND: Because there are two tracks, ideally at least one professional development lead and at least one (preferably two—one mathematics and one English Language Arts) instructional lead should attend.
